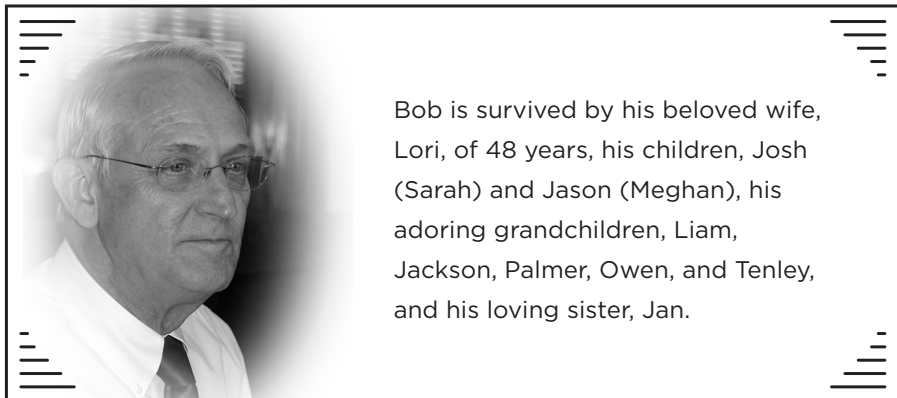

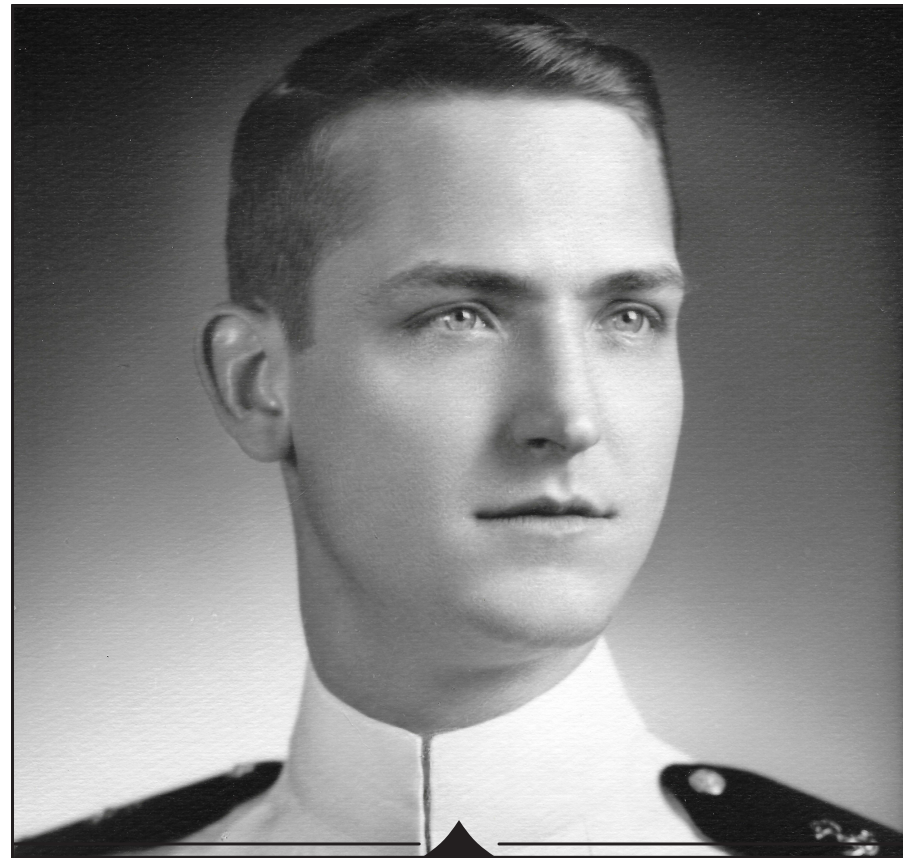

Born on July 11, 1943 in Muskogee, OK, Bob was the eldest child of Robert and Reita Scarbrough. He was raised in Pratt, KS, and graduated from Pratt High School before spending one year at Wentworth Military Academy in Lexington, MO. He then accepted an appointment to the United States Naval Academy. As a Midshipman, he competed for the Brigade in varsity track and was a member of Seventh Company, Second Battalion. He was a proud graduate of the Class of 1966, earning a Bachelor’s Degree in Engineering.

Following his time in Annapolis, he dutifully served the United States Navy for 10 years. He was awarded, among others, a Silver Star, two Bronze Stars (each with Combat V), and two Navy Commendation Medals (each with Combat V). He concluded his service as the Engineering Officer for Fleet Training Group Pearl Harbor. Throughout his life, he remained incredibly humble and seldom spoke of his time serving our nation.

While stationed at Pearl Harbor, he completed a Master’s Degree in Systems Management at the University of Southern California (Hawaii). After leaving the Navy in 1976, he went on to earn a Master’s Degree in Business Administration from the University of Michigan. Moving to northern Virginia in 1978, he continued to work with our armed forces in the private sector as a Consultant and Analyst for more than three decades. From 2010 to 2018, he concluded his professional career with DFAS as a Financial Analyst.

Bob was known for his uncanny ability to “get the job done”. He was a true perfectionist; reluctant to surrender command, but always willing to recruit and educate. He shared his eldest son’s love for baseball and his youngest son’s love for automobiles. To him, becoming “Grandpa” was his crowning achievement. He rejoiced upon the arrival of each of his beloved grandchildren and relished every minute he spent with them. His love for his family was unyielding.
